Vermont Player Wins \$600,000 Powerball Prize

Win represents second largest Powerball prize ever won in Vermont

BERLIN, VT. – November 29, 2007 – Someone in Vermont will have a greener holiday season after winning \$600,000 during Wednesday’s Powerball draw.

The unknown player won the prize by having five of the winning numbers without the Powerball number and choosing the Power Play option for an extra \$1, which tripled their original prize of \$200,000. Power Play is a special feature that allows a winner to multiply the original non-jackpot prize by 2, 3, 4 or 5 times. The number is chosen at random before each draw.

The winning ticket was purchased at the C.H. Stearns Co. Mobil station in Johnson, and is the only \$600,000 Powerball prize won in the country last night.

“Wednesday’s lucky winner showed the benefits of choosing the Power Play option, which for \$1 allowed the player to triple their winnings,” said Lottery Executive Director Alan Yandow. “For a \$2 investment, someone in Vermont is going to have a pretty good holiday season.”
